1. EMWIS Technical Unit announces the organisation of **the 5th Coordination seminar of the EMWIS National Focal Points**, that will be held in **Amman (Jordan)** the days: **27-29 September 2005**. The aim of this co-ordination seminar is: to analyse the current progress of EMWIS and its National Focal Points, to review the organisation of the Euromed conference of the 35 Water General Directors (Italy, November 2005), including strategic plan for future EMWIS developments, and to plan the joint activities for 2006. IN BRIEF

2. The next « **EURO-INBO 2005** » international meeting, organized by the « Group of European Basin Organizations for the Implementation of **the Water Framework Directive** », will take place, at the invitation of the Minister for Agriculture, Rural Areas and the Environment of the Walloon Region on **29, 30 September and 1st October 2005 in Namur** (Walloon region, Belgium). The meeting, which fits in the European cycle of the preparation of the 4th World Water Forum of MEXICO CITY in March 2006, will be organized around two broad main and current working topics: 1) the participation of the populations in the definition of water policy; and 2) transboundary Rivers and international districts. The « EURO-INBO 2005 » meeting itself will be preceded, on Wednesday 28 September 2005 in the afternoon, by the Liaison Bureau of the Central and Eastern European Network of Basin Organizations (CEENBO), by the Management Committee of the Mediterranean Network of Basin Organizations (MENBO) and an exceptional meeting of INBO International Liaison Bureau held concurrently. Any useful information will be continuously available on [the website](#).

3. As part of its commitment to **the EU Water Initiative**, the EC has invited 10 renowned experts, five from Europe and five from Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Mediterranean to review what lessons can be learnt from those projects, how much research results have been used to inform practice and how this should inform future cooperation in **IWRM** (Integrated Water Resources Management). With a European investment in some [50 international S&T cooperation projects](#) addressing integrated water resources management (IWRM) over the last 10 years, it is time to take stock. Integrated water resources management is a key concept of **the European Water Framework Directive** (WFD) that also influences water policies and management discourses in many parts of the world. 4. The Sixth Annual Survey on the implementation and enforcement of **Community environmental law**, which covers the year 2004, follows on previous Surveys by providing up-to-date information on the state of application of Community environmental law. This is in response to the EC Communication on implementing Community environmental law (COM(96)500 final) and the related Resolutions thereon of the Council and European Parliament. This survey aims to inform the public about the state of implementation of EU environmental legislation and about the comparative compliance records of all Member States. 5. WWF welcomed the decision by **the Moroccan government** to designate 20 new wetland sites in the country, which will be protected under **the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands**. These new sites will be added to the four sites already protected by the Convention since 1980. The decision by the Moroccan government to increase the number and area of protected wetland sites is a result of collaboration between Morocco's High Commission for Water and Forests and Combating Desertification, and the Scientific Institute of Rabat, with support from WWF through its freshwater programmes. The wetlands selected by the Moroccan government represent, together with the already existing Ramsar sites, an area of 243.260ha. 6. Based at the Stockholm International Water Institute, the Facility will provide **policy support and advice on water governance** to meet demands at local, national and river basin levels. Visit [SIWI website](#) for further information.

7. Agricultural smallholdings outside central Tripoli are dwarfed next to a set of **vast irrigated fields**, as seen from the Korea Multi-purpose Satellite (KOMPSAT-1). **Libya** is richer in water than

it might first appear, with vast amounts of water stored in gigantic underground aquifers beneath the arid Sahara. These aquifers are a legacy from around 10 000 years ago, when this territory was green savannah and highland forest, with rivers and lakes that were regularly replenished with rains. 8. After appearing in a number of major cities and capitals around the world (amongst them Paris, Chicago, Mexico, Montreal, London and Stockholm) the exhibition "**Earth from Above**" will be in Cyprus for two months, starting in September 2005. The open-air, free admissions, 24 hour exhibition will be hosted in Nicosia on Ledra Street. This aim is taken a step further through educational programs which will be held throughout the two months, raising environmental awareness in school children and stimulating them to think of ways to protect the environment and to preserve the precious resources of our planet which are rapidly diminishing. 9. The IW: LEARN Programme of the Global Environment Facility (GEF) aims to strengthen Integrated Water Resources Management (**IWRM**) by facilitating structured learning and information sharing among stakeholders. The goals of one activity of the project over the period May 2005 to October 2006 are to contribute to the cross-fertilization between competent organizations and persons with roles within the river commissions and other joint bodies in SEE (Southeastern Europe) and, at the same time, to allow for the introduction of new elements and experiences from outside the region. The '**countries of focus**' are Albania, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, FYR Macedonia, Romania and Serbia & Montenegro. Neighbouring countries – Greece, Hungary, Moldova, Slovenia and Turkey will be included where relevant. The First Technical / Coordination Meeting will take place from **15 to 16 September 2005**, in **Athens, Greece**. It will be attended by representatives of the Core Partners and by representatives of related on-going key initiatives, major projects and resource experts. 10. The 4th General Assembly of **the World Water Council** will be held on November 14th-16th, 2005, in Marseille, France. The General Assembly is a unique opportunity for members to directly influence the management and future orientation of the Council by discussing and voting on its internal policies and programs. It is also on this occasion that the new members of the Board of Governors will be elected for a term of three years, and the host country for the 5th World Water Forum will be chosen. 11. The EC has adopted on 17 August the Decision establishing the register of sites to form **the intercalibration network**. The text has been adopted as voted in the last Committee meeting on 20 May 2005. The English version of the final text has been uploaded in the public part of [WFD CIRCA](#). The Decision will be published in the Official Journal in all 20 official languages within a month.

16. "**Filamentous Bacteria in Industrial Wastewater Treatment Plants**" is a new publication of IWA, that presents completely new information on filamentous populations, responsible for poor settling sludge (bulking) in industrial wastewater treatment plants (WTPs). The results presented are based on a six-year EU-sponsored research program carried out by a consortium comprising Dutch (Bioclear and TNO), Italian (CNR), Danish (TU Aalborg) and German (Vermicon) partners. The research program included approximately 200 treatment plants, covering a wide range of industrial sectors. See [IWA publishing](#) for further details.

"**Computational Methods in the Management of Hydro-Environmental Systems**", is a new book that provides concise, up-to-date and easy-to-follow information on an increasingly important area of hydro-environmental analysis and management. It covers important aspects of both surface and subsurface water quality management, as they are inseparable components of aquifers and the flow in physical domains occur in combination with the other. However, the main emphasis of the book is on the practical development and application of computer based algorithms, via appropriate schemes, to realistic problems.
